Pre-Meeting Speaker

Anthony Haynes, Associate Vice President and Director of State Relations addressed the faculty senate beginning with the political climate in Nashville:

- There is no bigger issue than the budget
- There will be a \$2 to \$3 billion shortfall when compared to 2 years ago
- Some Tennessee counties are up to 25% unemployment rate
- It will be 10 years before we see a return to spending in higher education
- UT needs to trim \$65-\$85million from the budget over the next two years.
- UTHSC is non-formula funded. Formula funding is for undergraduate schools
- Thus far higher education has been somewhat protected throughout the budget cuts.
- Tennessee has the second lowest graduation rate among all states in the country.
- We need to improve graduation rates
- UTC is above capacity for students

- UTK is at capacity
- UTHSC has the highest numbers in history
- All schools are experience a high student enrollment.
- Community colleges must be tapped for their ability to educate.
- For profit and proprietary school have retained effective, expensive lobbyists in Nashville want to pass legislation to directly articulate their programs with the public universities. TN has failed to regulate these schools. It would be difficult for the TN schools to measure quality of entering students if we allow this to happen. State dollars should not be sent to these non-state schools.
- Faculty need to be engaged and involved in the legislation
- Show up in numbers
- Work with the legislative resources committee, chaired by Martin Donaldson
- Legislative reports will be placed on blackboard for faculty to view
