Family Medicine Residency Obstetrics I Rotation

Rotation Goal

The overall educational goal for the Obstetrics curriculum in the Family Medicine residency Program will be that the Resident gain competency in the management of normal and problem pregnancies.

The OB Core rotation for the First Year residents consists of 2 months managing Labor and Post Partum units. For second year residents the OB Core Rotation consists of one month supervising and assisting the First year resident in managing the OB ED, Antepartum, Labor and Postpartum units. These rotations are performed exclusively at Jackson Madison County General Hospital. During the rotation each resident will have at least one half day but no more than 2 half days per week in the Family Medicine Clinic.

Supervision of Labor and Delivery is performed by Faculty physicians, and Family Resident Physicians who are second and third year Residents and have completed at least thirty deliveries. Board Certified Obstetricians serve in a back up capacity.

In the Course of the 3 year program they will have the opportunity to work with one on one with an sub-specialty attending as well as Family Medicine attending with the goal of becoming proficient in the recognition management and the appropriate triage of both normal and problem obstetrical patients.

Educational Objectives in Obstetrics will include conferences and Didactic programs during the 3 year program. 1st year Rotation: The resident will spend 2 months on the Obstetrical service in house on OB ED, Labor and Delivery, Antepartum and Postpartum Units. Each resident will spend 1 half day in their continuity clinic at the UTFMC. The resident will have rotation in OB Chart review at the UTFMC.

Supervision

Supervision is provided by direct observation by attending physician and senior resident. Attending Physicians include Ruth Baker, M.D. FACOG; Gregg Mitchell, M.D., Scott Sadler M.D., Grant Studebaker, M.D., Christopher Knight, M.D and Justin Turner, M.D.

Rotation Objectives

By the end of the Obstetrics I rotation, PGY I residents are expected to expand and cultivate skills and knowledge learned during previous training and to achieve the following objectives based on the six general competencies.
