- A journal browsing/reading tool
- Access via web browsers and on mobile devices
- Syncing between web and mobile devices
- Free and licensed options

Emails: Keeping Up To Date

Key points:

- Need to create a personal account with each source to set up and manage alerts
- Choose alert frequency (e.g., daily, weekly, or monthly)
- Manage alerts

A journal's Table of Contents (TOC)

Individual journal websites

An article/A Citation/An Author

Scopus, Journal websites (e.g., ScienceDirect)
