June 16, 2011 Luncheon Meeting

Guest speaker, Chancellor Steve Schwab spoke briefly about the "State of UTHSC." ## RETIREE SPOTLIGHT



The spotlight is shining on Linda Moon Gregory. Linda retired in 2009 as Director of Student Affairs in the College of Medicine. The following is an excerpt from the Camdenton, MO News printed May 23, 2011.

Linda Moon Gregory of Germantown, TN, surviving sibling of officer James Moon with the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office who was killed in the line of duty on September 27, 1971, will continue to serve for her second year as the 15th National President of Concerns of Police Survivors (C.O.P.S.). Linda was re-elected as National President on May 16, 2011, at the closing ceremony of the National Police Survivors Conference in Washington, D.C. Linda served on the C.O.P.S. National Board as the Southern Seaboard Region Trustee for two years prior to her National President election. As the Southern Seaboard Trustee, she has helped numerous law enforcement survivors during their greatest time of need in North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Kentucky, and Tennessee. Linda is also the Chapter Director of the West Tennessee C.O.P.S. Chapter. Concerns of Police Survivors is a National, non-profit organization dedicated to helping the surviving families and co-workers of America's fallen law enforcement officers rebuild their shattered lives. C.O.P.S. membership is comprised of over 15,000 surviving families, all of whom have lost a loved one in the line of duty. Unfortunately, every year that membership continues to grow as, on average, 140 -160 law enforcement officers are killed while serving in the law enforcement profession.
